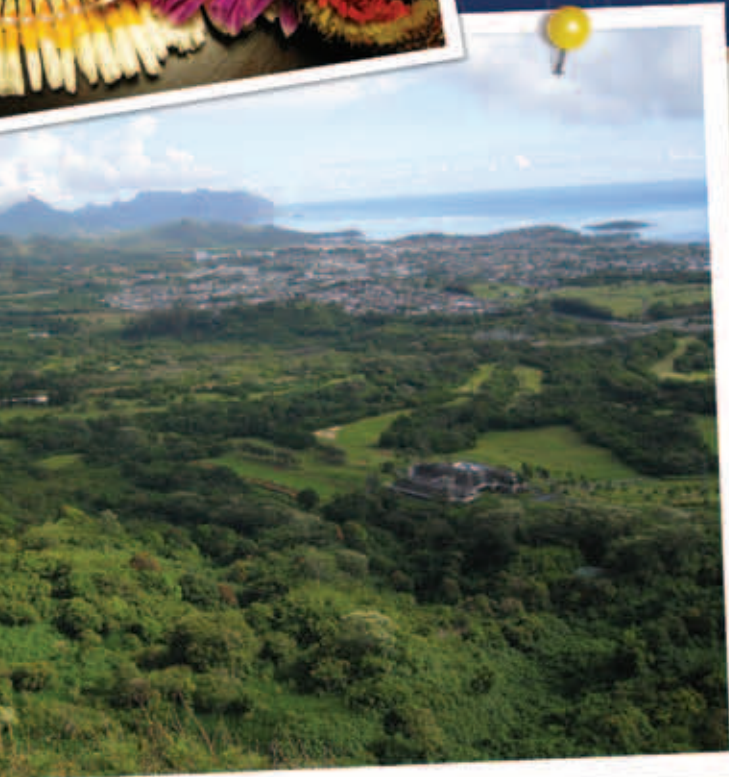

Preparing for 2011 World Forum
